The work that Year 5 undertook to understand reversible and irreversible change was incredibly precise an detailed.

The Academy's commitment to stand up to bullying and ensure that the children are able to look after themselves and each other was celebrated on the now annual 'odd socks day'. Year 6 continued the theme of empathy throughout this month, learning with wonderful maturity as they took part in an evacuee day and a visit to the Bomber Command memorial. These opportunities not only enable our older children to really develop their empathy, they also build strong historical knowledge. As Historians, they have been able to use evidence to develop a strong understanding of such a significant part of our History. This culminated in them leading a very special Remembrance service.

Not only have our oldest pupils demonstrated that they are Historians, we have also seen our Year 1 children become the first exhibitors in our Ling Moor museum. Their work on Lincoln Castle and Guy Fawkes is very impressive.

This year we are spending time focusing on out Design and Technology curriculum to ensure that the children are developing the necessary skills and knowledge and have great design experiences. The work that Year 1 and 4 have done on using different materials to construct is very positive.

Year 3 have thoroughly enjoyed their outdoor learning this month showing superb wisdom and

perseverance as they constructed shelters.

The children have certainly been enjoying the new Key Stage 2 playground equipment with more to follow. Mrs Walsh and Mrs Barnes, who organised the new equipment, are currently working with the children to identify what we need next to make playtimes even better. They are very grateful to our Friends of Ling Moor for their donations that made the playground improvements possible.
